The immunosuppressive therapy of acute rejection in liver transplantation. New strategies and their pathophysiological bases.
- **Annexed theses:**
 - The lidocaine/monoethylglycinexylidide test is unreliable for the assessment of liver donors.
 - Bronchopulmonary disorders requiring a long duration of steroid therapy are associated with a higher risk of steroid-related complications after surgery.
 - Tumoral resection improves the prognosis of patients with cholangiocarcinoma of the extra-hepatic bile duct.
